Opening Remarks by Chairman Shukuri (Video Message) for the APTA-JITI Joint Session in Toronto Canada on June 25th, 2019

I would like to genuinely extend my appreciation to President and Chief Executive Officer Paul Skoutelas and the personnel of APTA for the realization of today's joint session, the first project embodying our collaboration which we agreed to strengthen during my visit to the APTA headquarters in Washington D.C. last October. In addition, I would like to express thanks for the attendance of Ms. Jane Williams, Acting Administrator of the Federal Transit Administration, and Ms. Takako Ito, Consul-General of Japan in Toronto. I am also delighted to have all of the distinguished speakers, moderator, and guests participating in our session.
