

Purple Line under construction in Montgomery and Prince George's Counties Within the Baltimore region, MTA contributes only 0.2% of transportation emissions

MARC

Purple Line



- 16.2-mile light rail line that will provide reliable east-west travel in Montgomery and Prince George's counties (DC suburbs)
 - Reduced congestion
 - Multimodal connections
 - Environmental benefits
 - Economic growth and job creation
- Equitable TOD approach
 - Partnership with National Center for Smart Growth (NCSG) at the University of Maryland
 - Data-driven strategy
 - Equity and people-first access
 - Land use planning and zoning
- Over \$2 billion in real estate investment planned or underway along the corridor
 - ~8 million sq ft of development
