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Prof. UTSUNOMIYA Kiyohito is Professor of Economics at Kansai University, Japan. He graduated from the Faculty of Economics at Kyoto University and earned a Master's Degree in Economics from the University of Manchester. He later obtained a Ph.D. in Economics from Kyoto University. His academic expertise lies in transportation economics and econometrics.

Before entering academia, Prof. Utsunomiya built an extensive career at the Bank of Japan, where he held several senior positions, including Director of the Price Statistics Division and Director of the Institute for Monetary and Economic Studies. He joined Kansai University in 2011 and also served as Visiting Professor at the Vienna University of Technology in 2017.

Prof. Utsunomiya is a leading scholar in the field of public transportation policy and regional mobility. He currently serves as Vice President of the Japan Society of Transportation Economics. His notable publication, Integrated Policies for Regional Public Transportation (2020), received both the Japan Society of Transportation Economics Award and the International Association of Traffic and Safety Sciences Award in 2021. His research focuses on regional public transport systems, transportation policy, and quantitative economic analysis.
