



## Strengthening US-Japan Relations & Collaboration on Shared Challenges

- Founded in 1975 in New York City, with staff in NYC and Washington, DC area
- Non-governmental organization, non-profit, independent and non-partisan
- Diverse funders (foundations, government, corporations, and individuals)
- Many joint programs with JCIE/Japan, a pioneer of US-Japan legislative dialogues in the late 1960s




# TOWARD INTERNATIONAL & US-JAPAN EVENTS

## Japan-US Joint Leaders' Statement (May 2022 Summit)

### Hiroshima G7 Global Health Task Force



Prime Minister Kishida and President Biden, recognizing that the **pandemic has made promoting gender equity more important than ever**, concurred that ensuring that all people, regardless of gender identity, can achieve their full potential is both a moral and strategic imperative, critical to every aspect of society and the economy. The two leaders also emphasized the importance of preventing and addressing gender-based violence, including conflict-related sexual violence.
