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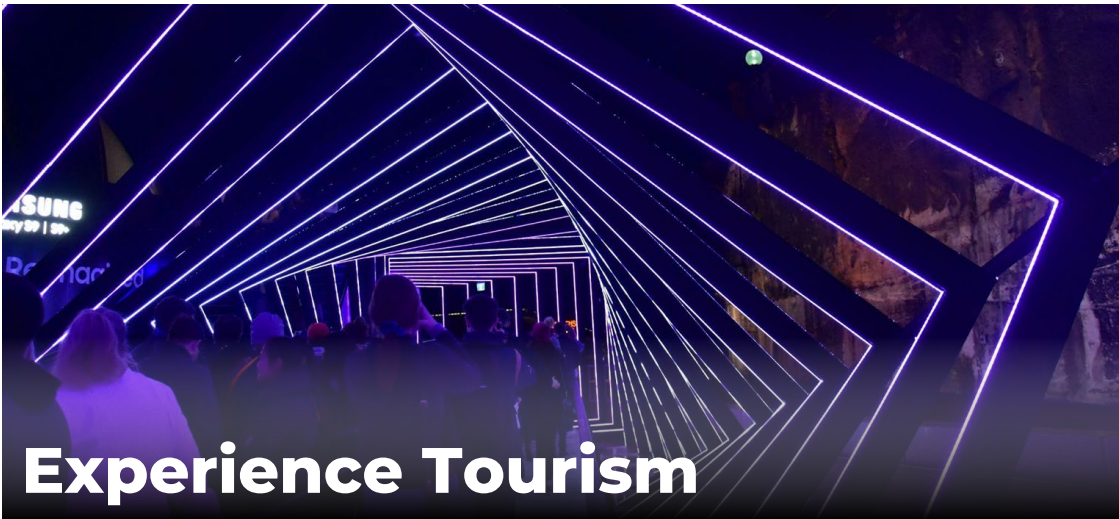

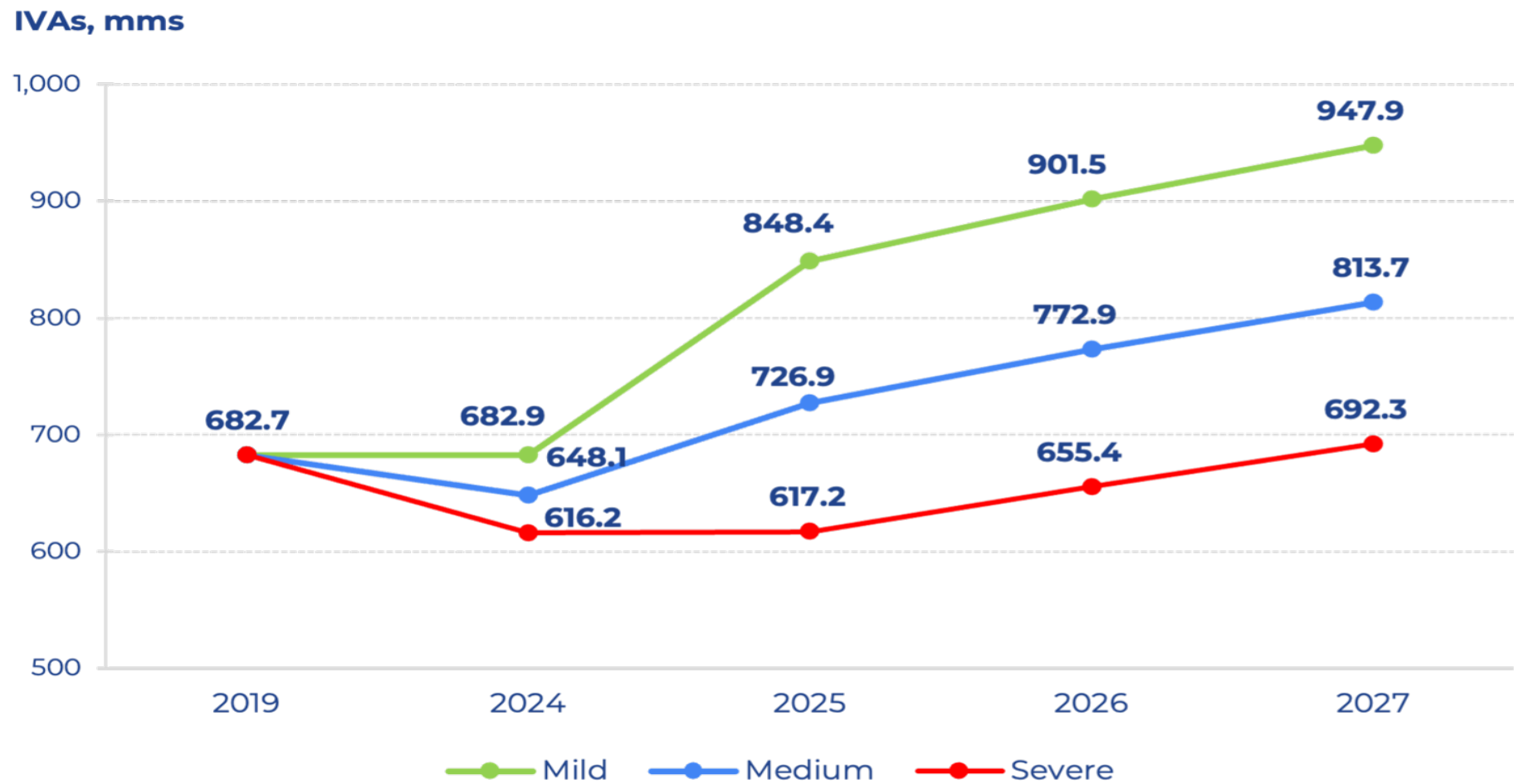

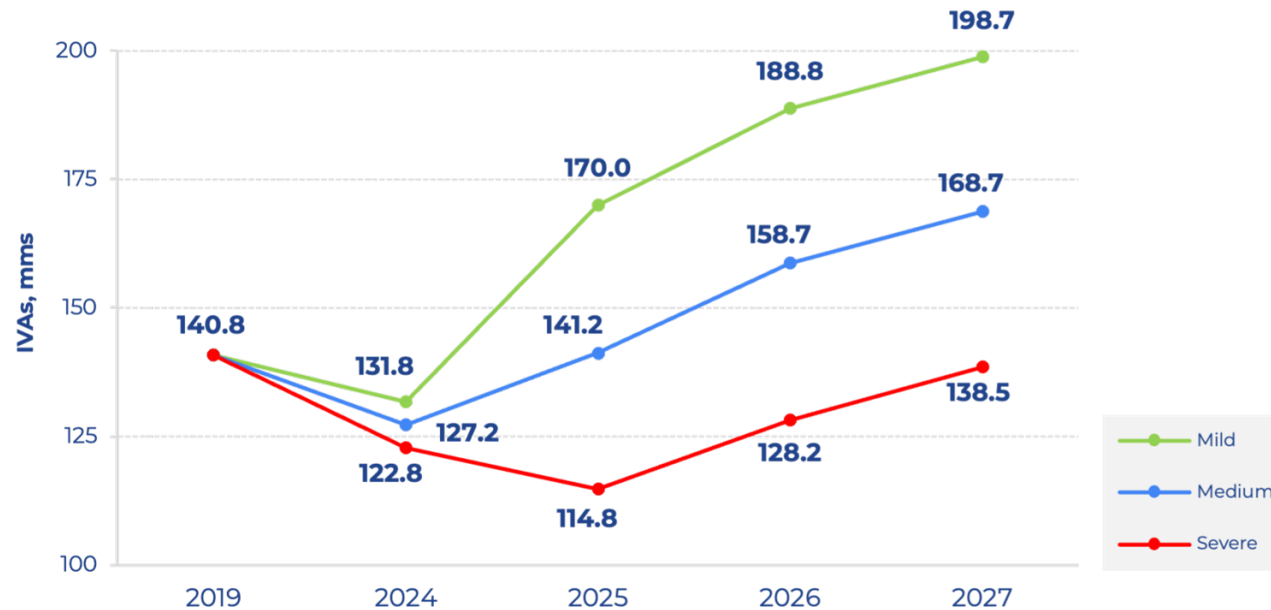
# Forecast of visitor arrivals into Asia Pacific 2025 - 2027, by Scenario

# Forecast of visitor arrivals into Southeast Asia 2025 - 2027, by Scenario



- Under Medium Scenario, Southeast Asia see a moderate recovery to 119.8% by 2027, suggesting consistent growth across the region.
- Even under challenging conditions, recovery reaches 98.41% of pre-pandemic levels by 2027, showcasing resilience.
- Thailand, Singapore, and Vietnam are driving Southeast Asia's recovery, with strong growth across all scenarios.
- Regional resilience is evident, with even the Severe scenario showing recovery nearing pre-pandemic levels by 2027.
- Domestic and intra-regional travel demand continues to be a key driver for countries like Indonesia and Malaysia.

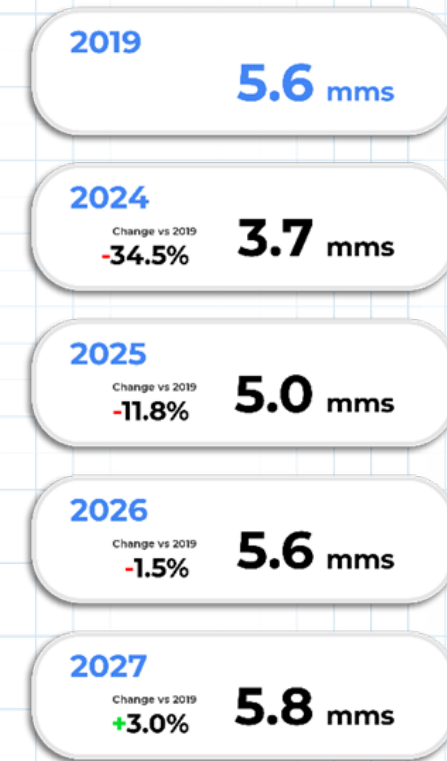

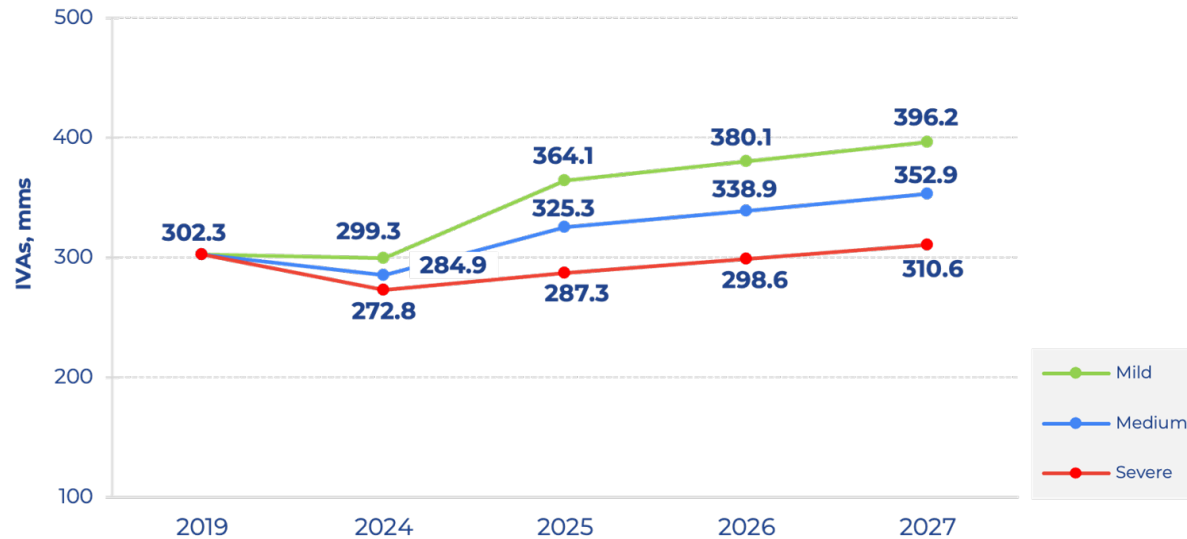

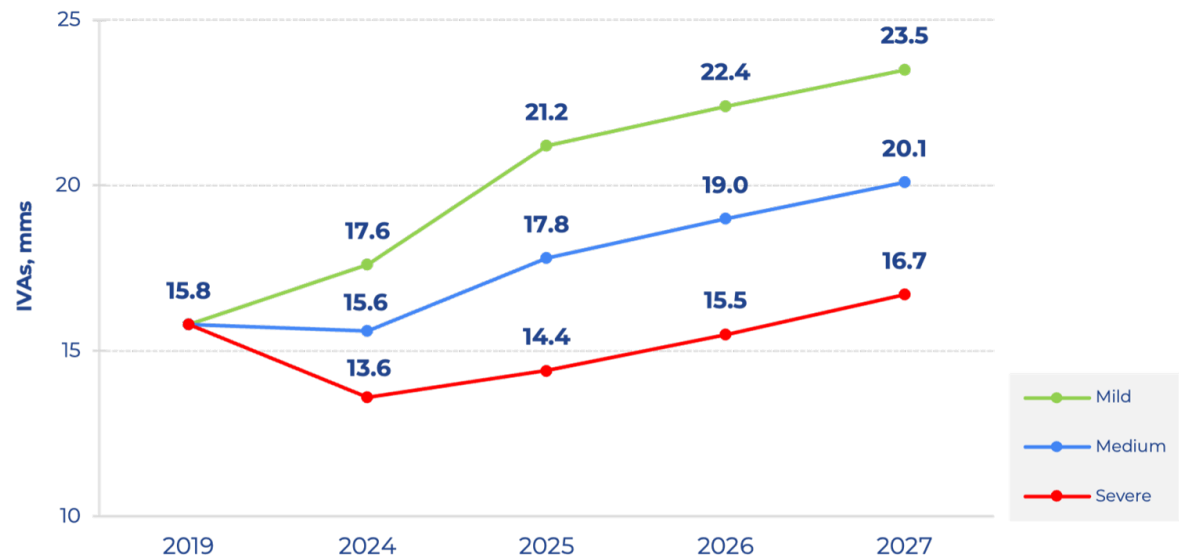

- Mild Scenario projects the most robust growth, with arrivals reaching 396 million by 2027 (131% of 2019 levels).
- Medium Scenario suggests moderate recovery, reaching 352 million by 2027 (117% of 2019 levels).
- Northeast Asia is set for a strong rebound, particularly under the Mild and Medium Scenarios.
- China, Japan, and Korea (ROK) are key drivers of the region's recovery.
- In the Mild Scenario, arrivals skyrocket to 150% of pre-pandemic levels by 2027.
- Even in the Severe Scenario, Hong Kong still sees notable growth, reaching 98% of 2019 levels.

# Forecast of visitor arrivals into South Asia 2025 - 2027, by Scenario



- Total arrivals grow from 15.8M in 2019 to 20.1M by 2027 (127.2% of 2019 levels).
- India dominates South Asia’s tourism recovery, influencing regional trends.
- Maldives and Sri Lanka emerge as top performers, benefiting from strong leisure demand.
- Nepal and Bhutan show steady but slower growth, indicating reliance on niche travel segments.

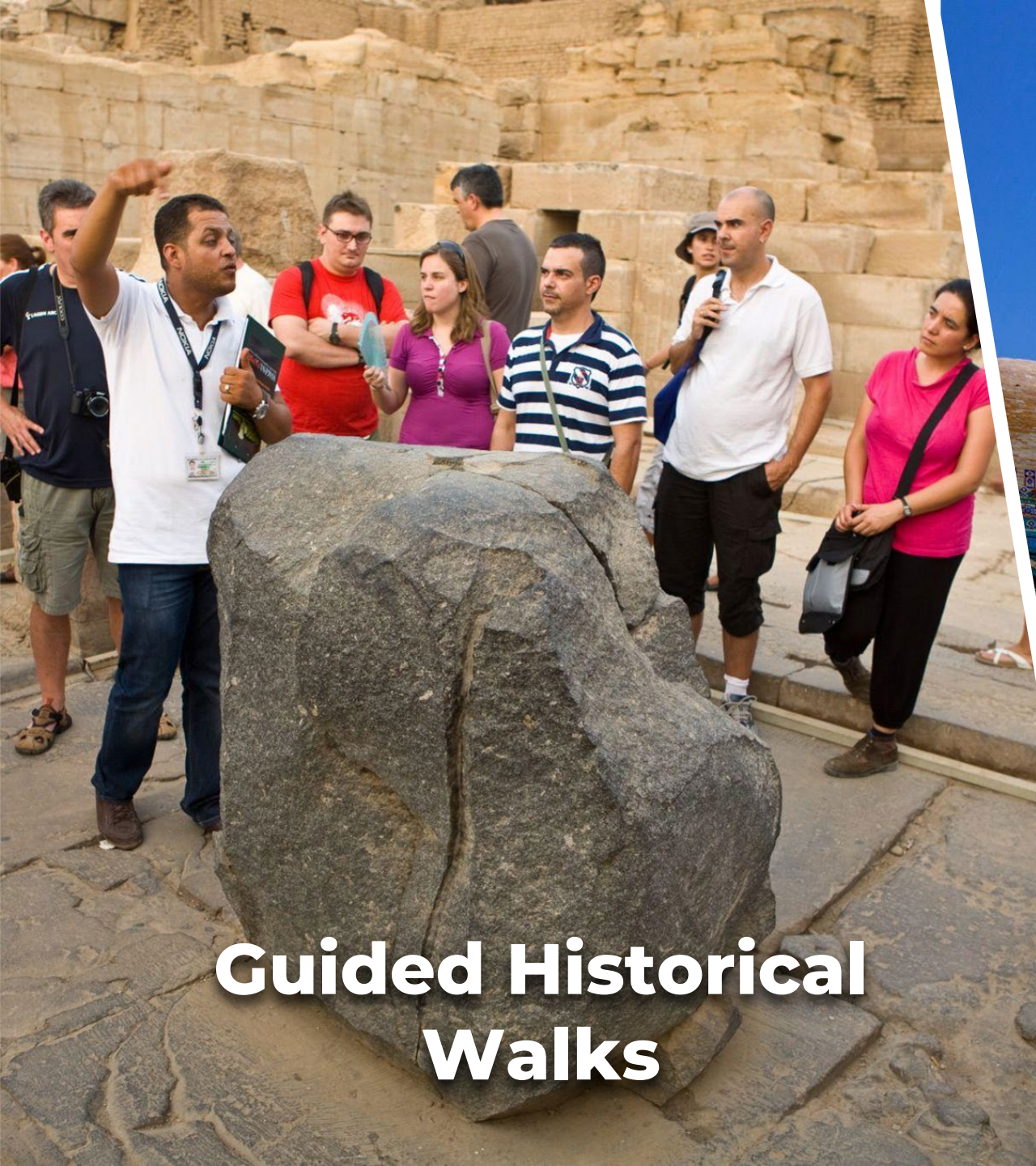
